Reset the MySQL Root Password, Linux OS

By default, the MySQL installation that ships with XAMPP has an empty root password. This is a serious security risk, especially if you plan to use XAMPP in production scenarios.

To change the MySQL root password, follow these steps:

- 1. Ensure that the MySQL server is running.
- 2. Open a new Linux terminal.
- 3. Use the *mysqladmin* command-line utility to alter the MySQL password, using the following syntax:

mysqladmin --user=root password "newpassword"

The *mysqladmin* command-line utility is located within the *bin/* subdirectory of the XAMPP installation directory, typically */opt/lampp*.

For example, to change the MySQL root password from its default empty value to the password *gue55me*, you would execute:

/opt/lampp/bin/mysqladmin --user=root password "gue55me"

Reset or Set a Root Password, XAMPP running under Microsoft OS

Configure it with the XAMPP Shell (command prompt) --- Works; https://stackoverflow.com/questions/24566453/resetting-mysql-root-password-with-xampp-on-localhost

- Open the shell from the XAMPP control pane
- Navigate to the directory:
 - o C:\xampp\mysql\bin
- Execute this command:
 - o mysqladmin.exe –u root password secret
 - THIS set password to 'secret'
- Go back to mysql directory:
 - C:\xampp\mysql
- Run the following command to connect to the database
 - o mysql –u root –p
 - o Enter Passwords: *****

How can I set a root password in MySQL? <NOT Working>

- 1. Go to c:/xampp/mysql
- 2. Open resetroot.bat

- 3. Look for Line 8
- 4. ADD mysql\bin\mysql.exe datadir=c:/xampp/mysql/data

- Go to your xampp\mysql\bin\ folder
- Edit my.ini and insert skip-grant-tables below [mysqld]
- Restart MySQL
- Set new password for your root user by running UPDATE mysql.user SET
 Password=PASSWORD('new_password') WHERE User='root' in phpMyAdmin in the
 mysql database (or just leave it like this if MySQL cannot be accessed from remote
 hosts)
- Remove the skip-grant-tables in the my.ini fileGo to your xampp\mysql\bin\ folder
- 3. How to change the root password for MySQL in XAMPP?
 - Method 1: Reset through Web interface <NOT Working>
 - o http://localhost:PORT/security
 - o PORT = 336
 - Method 2: Through SQL update <NOT Working>
 - In phpMyAdmin => SQL tab, then enter
 - UPDATE mysql.user SET Password=PASSWORD('password') WHER User='root';
 FLUSH PRIVILEGES:
